### **Cherokee Development Authority**

- Water / Sewer line project on 6<sup>th</sup> Street has been completed.
- We have begun the process of digitalizing our water and sewer maps. This project is being paid for from a grant awarded through OWRB.
- There is a sinkhole in the 700 Block of Oklahoma caused from a customer sewer line collapsing. Road will be repaired the next time we have a cement truck.
- Datahighway + Gateway at RO plant is beginning to fail, and software is obsolete. To keep our RO Plant working properly, this needs to be replaced with an updated model. This purchase was authorized for \$9.593.00.
- The City of Cherokee was ranked priority #4 for the water valve replacement program. Without additional funds added to the grant by the State of Oklahoma, there will not be funding available after completing project ranked priority #1.
- Water pump and motor on Skid 1 failed on Sunday. Both have been replaced. The old pump/motor will be evaluated to compare pricing of refurbishing or purchasing new.
- We have received one month of the water rate increases. The amount we received is higher than expected for Phase 1. If next month is higher than expected, I will recommend that we suspend Phase 2 of water rate increases until June 1, 2022, to allow us more time to collect data.
- The City of Cherokee was not awarded the REAP to extend the 12" waterline to the elementary school. We have \$85,000.00 in match funds that have been appropriated to this project.

#### **City of Cherokee**

- Street Department
  - o Culvert on E Jefferson has been replaced.
  - o City street in front of residence on S. Oklahoma has been repaired.

- o Numerous streets have been patched.
- The change order for the CDBG grant was accepted. This change order frees up approximately \$150,000.00 of appropriated funds designed for streets. I recommend that extend the scope of the project to include W 7<sup>th</sup> (from Ohio to Oklahoma). With remaining funds focus on Ohio Street, between 5<sup>th</sup> and Main and E 10<sup>th</sup> Street.

# Community

- O Special thanks to the First Christian Church Youth Group for painting picnic tables at the RV park as well as repairing / painting trash cans at the Cherokee Municipal Cemetery.
- Attended meeting in Alva on 10/28 in reference to joining other communities to bid one large infrastructure project. There will be a future meeting in Alva on 11/15 and a meeting in OKC on 11/17.
- o Rural Housing Initiative sponsored by NODA (see page 3 & 4)
- O Had a meeting about the Safe Route to School TAP Grant on 11/8/21. 90% Plans have been submitted. Hoping project will begin by May 2022. Due to the increase of pricing, it is possible Phase 1 will have to be scaled back to ensure we do not go over budget. We will know more once a bid for the project is accepted.

- o The Roberta J. Patton Trust issued the following donations:
  - Cherokee Fire Department \$110,072.36
  - Cherokee Municipal Cemetery \$55,036.18

Agree to personally occupy the dwelling as their primary residence

Be a U.S. Citizen, U.S. non-citizen national or Qualified Alien

# How may the funds be used?

- New residential property to be used as a permanent residence. Structures can be detached or attached, PUDs allowed (Cannot be an income-producing property). Closing costs and reasonable/customary expenses associated with the purchase may be included in the transaction.
- Purchaser cannot have any active participation in the building of the structure.
- Essential household equipment such as wall-to-wall carpeting, ovens, ranges, refrigerators, washers, dryers, heating, and cooling equipment if the equipment is conveyed with the dwelling
- Site preparation costs, including grading, foundation plantings, seeding or sod installation, trees, walks, fences and driveways

# **Lot Requirements**

- Can be privately or city owned
- Must have a warranty deed , title insurance, abstract
- Lot minimum of width of 50'
- Available utilities: Water, sewer, electricity, Natural Gas
- Lot must be clean (ready-to-build condition)
- To be included in the municipal pool for 12 months
- Locked price (set by seller) -Price cannot change once listed





# Responsibilities of the city

- Locate and Identify available lots
- Check lots to ensure they meet above qualifications
- Compose list of available properties and submit them to the Oklahoma Municipal League
- Market this program to local residents, employers, and schools
- Pass local ordinances on agreeing to participate in the program (available from the Oklahoma municipal league)

Another busy month in the library! With a total of 398 patrons in the library, we had a total of 11 programs, some in the library, and some outreach. It was a good month for CCCL.

# Program break-down:

Our most popular program this month was an outreach, CCCL had a booth at the Family Fun Festival at the Fairgrounds on October 23, with 22 different people stopping by our booth to see what new things are happening at the library. We had books on display, library card applications, and flyers for several different upcoming programs. It was a good afternoon. At the same time, CCCL was open on Grand to participate in October Stroll, and we had our Book Sale going on. I'm told it was a big day.

The other big program for the month continues to be our Adult Book Club (ABC). This month we are reading *All Boys Aren't Blue* by George M. Johnson, a memoir manifesto. In December, we will read *Concrete Rose* by Angie Thomas.

#### Circulation:

Our circulation numbers in house are 536, and electronic are 198, both are good numbers for a library of this size. I would like to see the electronic numbers go up, and I'm still devising a strategy on how to make that happen.

#### **New Book Arrivals:**

In October, we only had 18 Juvenile books, and 19 Adult books arrive at the library. There are lots of different reasons for this, but it's easiest to explain that the companies that have our orders are experiencing the same supply difficulties that everyone else is.

#### **Upcoming Events:**

In November, Cherokee will have the opportunity to write a book on Gratitude and publish it in the library. Each Tuesday afternoon, time is set aside for writing in the library called "Gratitude Attitude" from 4-6p; we are going to take all those writings and use one of our machines and publish a book to be available for check-out in the future.

Partnering with OSU Extension Office, CCCL is hosting a 4 month cooking class call "What's Cookin' Cherokee" beginning Nov. 19 at 6:00p. And we will be closed Nov. 11 for Veteran's Day, and Nov. 25-28 for Thanksgiving.
